1. The loss of the genuine	¹¹ "Behold the days are coming" – oracle of sovereign Yahweh – "when I will send a famine on the land, not a famine for bread or a thirst for water, but a famine of hearing of Yahweh's words. ¹² They shall wander from sea to sea, from north to east. They will run here and there to seek the word of Yahweh – but they shall not find it."	
• Refusal to heed God's word leads to inability to hear God's word	Amos does not precisely say there would be a famine of the word. That might be true as well but what Amos says is that there would be a famine of the hearing of the Word. Refusal to hear the word results in inability to hear the word. And that leads to instability and confusion. The people will go 'from sea to sea'. The Dead Sea was in the south; the Mediterranean was in the west. They go eastward and northward as well. They look everywhere for a source of guidance but they do not hear any word from God, because they are unable to do so.

• The word is lost to the upcoming generation	The terms speak of young people. When the word is lost the upcoming generation know no better than to turn to the popular gods of the day. It was fashionable to swear by a god whose name was Ashimah; the name was similar to the Hebrew word for 'guilt' and Amos makes use of the fact. Also it seems that it was popular to swear by the blessings that were thought to come from a pilgrimage to Beersheba.	
	¹⁴ "'Those who swear by the Guilt of Samaria, whose who say 'As your god lives, O Dan' or 'As the way of Beersheba lives' – they shall fall and never rise again.'"	
Assyrian cults attract the young people	But the cults from Assyria which were attracting young people were drawing them into superstition, not into the life of godliness. As a result the entire community would be doomed. Soon the Assyrian armies would arrive and the entire northern nation would be swept away. These young people like everyone else would 'fall and never rise again'. The inability to hear God's word was fatal. Without God's word	
• Without God's word there can be no saving experience of God	there can be no saving experience of God. Religious superstition is a useless replacement for the life of faith. True faith cleanses from sin; religious superstition is designed to get some advantage or happiness from some god. The word of God received brings a knowledge of God. God stands by the altar, just as Jeroboam had once done. But He stands by the altar to destroy it. The entire superstitious temple at Bethel will be destroyed^{m1}. The nation will cease; the people will be killed. The judgement is inescapable if they will not repent – and now is so far gone that it is inescapable even if they do repent, as perhaps some did. Calamitous consequences might follow sin even when it is forgiven.
